- Class 2. 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Year Apprentice Shoe Making All 3 Days (45 Minutes)
  Open to 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Year apprentices under training at the date of the show.
  Competitors must work on their own or with another apprentice.
  Make a pair of Hind Fullered Concave as per Judges Specimen.

### **REGULATIONS & CONDITIONS**

### 1. Entries:

Competitors must complete an Official Entry Form and return it together with appropriate fees to John Ward at the East of England Agricultural Society, The Showground, Peterborough, PE2 6XE. To arrive not later than Friday 15<sup>th</sup> June.

### 2. Entry Fees:

Each Competitor is required to pay the entry fee for each class entered at the time of submitting their entry form. No entry fee or part thereof shall be returnable once a entry has been accepted and the competitor informed of their acceptance. **Please see Entry Form** 

3. Prize Money per Class: 1<sup>st</sup> £55, 2<sup>nd</sup> £20, 3<sup>rd</sup> £15, 4<sup>th</sup> £10.

In no case shall a prize be awarded unless the Judge, after consultation with the steward, deems the entries to have sufficient merit. Where there is only a small entry in a class, and the Judge, after consultation with the stewards, considers the entries unworthy of the highest or any other prize offered. It shall be in their power to withhold the award of such prizes. Cheques for prizes awarded will be forwarded by post to the winners after the show. The society reserves to itself by its council the sole and absolute right to interpret these regulations and conditions, to settle arbitrarily and determine all matters, questions, differences or objections arising out of, connected with or incidental to the show and to refuse or cancel the award of prize money and trophies or relax conditions as the Society deem expedient.

#### ALL COMPETITORS MUST REGISTER WITH THE CHIEF STEWARD ON ARRIVAL.

### 4. Attendance:

Competitors shall be required to be present and ready to commence work at the time, which will be notified to them in advance of the Show. Late arrival will be liable to disqualification.

### 5. Time Allowance:

The Judge will provide details of the shoes required. The Time allowance as shown. Overtime at the discretion of the Chief Steward. The Chief Steward and his assistant will be responsible for timekeeping and will enter details on the time board displayed below the clock in the Farriery shed.

### 6. Equipment:

Competitors must provide ALL their own tools. The Society will provide forges, fuel, steel, anvils, nails.

### 7. Strikers:

Each competitor must make their own arrangements for a striker. The striker's name must be shown on the entry form and the competitor must declare for whom they themselves may be acting as striker, in each class entered. No class can be delayed for a striker who is also acting as a striker for another or where the competitor themselves is acting as a striker and under these circumstances the Stewards may disqualify the competitor.

### 8. Objections

The Decision of the Judge and Stewards shall be final and binding on competitors and their strikers. Objections must be made in writing to the Chief Executive of the Society and accompanied by a deposit of £20. The objection shall be submitted within two hours of the completion of judging of the class in question. The deposit may be returned, whether the objection is upheld or not, provided that the objection is not considered to be frivolous, fractious or of malicious nature.
