

RULES FOR THE BFBA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

- 1. The 'class' to be named the 'BFBA National Championship'.
- 2. The 'class' to be open to those competitors with 1st/2nd or 3rd placings in Open National and County Competition during the previous three years.
- 3. Every competitor and striker in the Championship to be a <u>current year BFBA</u> <u>member</u>. A list of competitors and their strikers to be submitted to the BFBA office prior to the start of the Championship in order to check entry eligibility.
- 4. Two Judges (1 for feet, 1 for shoes) to be chosen from the WCF List of Approved Judges.
- 5. The BFBA Chief Steward to be in attendance in order to ensure that the class is run in accordance with the rules. Expenses (travel/accommodation if required) to be paid by the host Society/Organisation.
- 6. The host Society/Organisation to provide a minimum of £500 prize fund to the Champion, £200.00 to the Reserve Champion and prize cards.
- 7. The New Century Cup to be awarded to the Champion, The Frank Moorcroft Memorial Trophy to be awarded to the winner of the Best Shod Foot BOTH TROPHIES TO REMAIN THE PROPERTY OF THE BFBA.

Additional Awards: Mustad Gold Medal to the Champion BFBA (NAFBAE) Silver Medal to the Reserve Champion.

- 8. Entry fee £85 per competitor. Entry fees kept by the host Society/Organisation.
- 9. The class to follow the set format which is:

Each competitor to make, fit and nail on a three quarter fullered fore or hind shoe on a foot allocated.

Make one Heavy Horse Hind Shoe from 17 ½" x 1 ¼" x ½" with Calkins and plain stamped nail holes hammer drawn toe clip

and

One deep seated fullered bar shoe 1" x $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6" across $-6\frac{1}{2}$ " long

No implement striking another in the making of the clip, no flatters

Time limit 75 minutes

Striker allowed
