Prize Money (per pair): 1st - £150, 2nd - £100, 3rd - £90, 4th - £70, 5th - £50.

Regulations

1 Entries

Competitors must complete an official entry form and return it, together with fees, to the Suffolk Agricultural Association, Trinity Park, Felixstowe Road, Ipswich, Suffolk IP3 8UH, not later than 16 April 2018. Nominations and substitution entries are not allowed.

2 Entry Fees

No entry fee or part thereof shall be returnable once an entry has been accepted and the competitor informed of his/her acceptance.

3 Awards/Prize Money

Prizes may be withheld if the judge, in consultation with the Stewards, deems the entry to have insufficient merit. Prize giving for each class will take place on the afternoon of the day of competition. Cheques for prizes offered will be forwarded by post to the winners after the Show.

4 Attendance

Competitors must be present and ready to commence work at a time which will be notified to them in advance of the Show. Late comers will be liable to disqualification.

5 Forge numbers and horses will be drawn before the Show. Competitors must accept the foot allocated to them.

6 Time allowance

The judge will provide details of the shoes required. Points will be deducted from competitors who overrun.

7 Time Keeping

The Chief Steward and his assistants will be responsible for time keeping.

8 Equipment/Tools

Competitors must provide their own tools. The Association will provide forges, fuel, anvils, nails and steel (details of the steel will be given when tickets are issued). The Stewards will not allow the use of freak tools. No flatters allowed.

9 Safety Clothing

To comply with health & safety regulations, all persons within the Forge area must provide their own and wear protective footwear, eye protection and apron/chaps. The stewards or judge may bar a competitor from competing if, in their opinion, the competitor has inadequate protective clothing/footwear and eye protection.

10 Competitors and their strikers will only be allowed on the shoeing floor when they are scheduled to compete.

11 Strikers

Each competitor must make his/her own arrangements for a striker. The striker's name must be shown on the entry form and the competitor must declare for whom he him/herself may be acting as striker in each class entered. No class can be delayed for a striker who is also acting as a striker for another competitor or where the competitor himself is acting as a striker and under these circumstances the steward may disqualify the competitor.

Strikers must not assist competitors beyond their capacity as Strikers.

12 Insurance

All competitors must have adequate personal insurance.

13 Objections

The decision of the Judge shall be final. Objections must be made in writing, addressed to the Executive Director/Secretary of the Association and be accompanied by a deposit of £50. (See By-law 37.)

14 Association Conditions

The Suffolk Agricultural Association reserves to itself by its Council the sole and absolute right to interpret these regulations and conditions and to settle arbitrarily and determine all matters, questions, differences or objections arising out of, connected with or incidental to the Show and to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify competitors, vary or cancel the award of prize money and trophies or relax conditions as the Association may deem expedient.
